Diné Early Childhood Cultural Teachings and Traditions

Hózhóojí doo lighaash (The Blessing Way Ceremony) is performed for expectant mothers, who are in their third trimester to protect them during childbirth and to ensure the baby's safe delivery. **Tó Asdzáán dóó Chahaheet Asdzáán** (Water Woman and Darkness Woman) nurture the child in the womb for nine months.

Hózhóogo Anoooséél /Jinooséél (Growing in Beauty) signifies that all Navajo children grow and develop into healthy individuals within an environment of caring parents, extended family and community.

Tádídíín Bizaajaa' (Feeding of the Corn Pollen) Immediately after birth, the baby is fed corn pollen and breast milk as an introduction to **Naadą́ą' dóó Nanise' Ch'iyáán** (Earth Foods). Thereafter, the Holy Ones maintain a constant vigil as the baby enters the earthly world of air, water, fire and elements of Mother Earth, Father Sky, Sunshine. In earlier times, when mothers gave birth in the Hogan, it was customary to briefly expose the baby's head to heat from the fireplace for ancestry purposes. **Ko'Diné'é** (Fire People) welcome the child to the living world to light and warmth. **Nahasdzáán dóó Yádiłhił** (Mother Earth and Father Sky) nurture the child's development to become a unique, balanced and purposeful individual.

K'é dóó Ádóone'é (Welcome of Kinship and Clans) The baby is welcomed with terms of endearment **Shiyázhí** (My Little One), **Shi'áwéé'** (My Baby) when the parents first get to hold their newborn. Thereafter, the child is told their four clans: **ninłj** (mother's clan; you are), **báshinilchíín** (father's clan; you are born for), **da nicheii** (your maternal grandfathers are), **da ninalí** (your paternal grandfathers are). The declaring of clans puts responsibility of the child on those who are recognized within the child's clan groups. The child will eventually learn they themselves are responsible for respecting and aiding those surrounding him/her representing the **K'é** (kinship) concept.

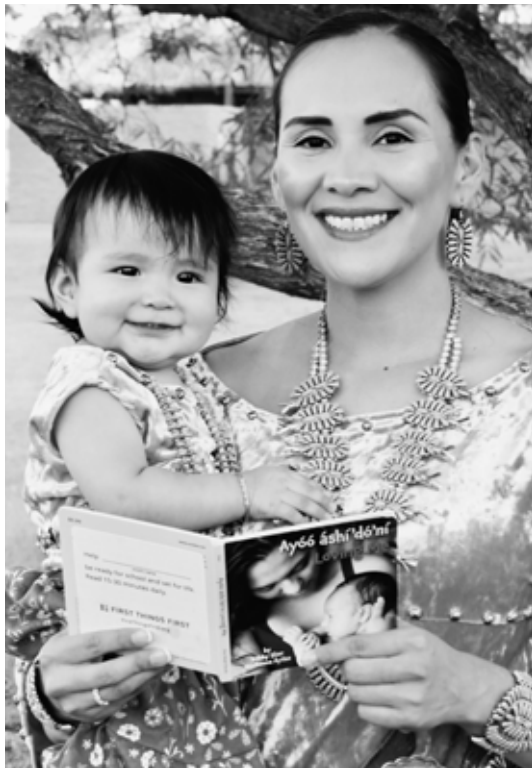
Bízhí' Ínééh (Naming Ceremony) Before the baby's first laugh, a respected or retired military relative is given the honor of giving the child their Diné name. The baby's name can be chosen based on a relative's characteristics or based on the baby's trait and image as a warrior. When the placenta is offered back to nature, the child is introduced by their sacred name. Traditionally, an appropriate name for a male baby was **Hashkéh** (Challenger with Anger), and an appropriate female baby's name was **Bah** or **Baa'** (Active in War).

Awééts'áál (Cradle Board) After the baby is born, a Cradle Board is made by the child's father, grandfather or uncle to keep the baby safe so the mother can do her daily chores. Cradle Boards are made of oak, cottonwood, pine or cedar trees and are laced together with thin strips of leather that represent **Atsoolghat** (Female Lightning), **Atsinilt'ish** (Male Lightning), **Akét'óól** (The Root) and **Shá Bit'óól** (Sunbeam). The Cradle Board features a wide, wooden **Nááts'íilid** (Rainbow) over the baby's head that protects the child. A **Yoolgai** (White Shell) stone is placed on the female child's right hand side of the Cradle Board. A **Doot'izhii** (Turquoise) stone is placed on the male child's lefthand side of the Cradle Board. Babies are wrapped tightly with a blanket and laced securely onto the board. It is believed that the flat board will give the baby a strong, straight back and that a soft supporting pad will help the infant form a nice round head while the security of the board produces a calm personality. The Cradle Board is blessed with corn pollen, prayers, songs and good thoughts for the baby. The design and construction of the Navajo style cradle board originated from **Hane'** of our mother, **Asdzáá Nádleehí/Yoolgail Asdzáán** (Changing Woman/White Shell Woman).

Áwéé' Ch'ídeeldlo' (Baby's First Laugh) Diné tradition states a baby is considered to be of two worlds at birth: first, that of the Holy People, and second, that of the Earth Surface People. As weeks pass, adults wait and listen for the child's first chuckle - a sign of joy that signals the desire to join his/her family and community. In commemoration of this event, the person who witnesses the first laugh/giggle hosts an **Áwéé' Ch'ídeeldlo'** (Baby's First Laugh Ceremony). Guests often bear gifts. Before partaking of the traditional meal, a line is formed to receive an offering from the baby. The host helps the baby as he/she places a small piece of salt in the guests' hand. The salt is placed on the food, and is meant to rejuvenate the good character in each recipient and serve as the first in a lifetime of generous acts by the child. Relatives will greet the child by kinship terms and express a life of generosity and gratitude. It is believed that when the child laughs, the Holy One blesses the child with personality, uniqueness and capabilities.

Early Brain Development Information

FIRST THINGS FIRST



90% of a child's brain develops by age 5.

You are your child's first teacher. The job of helping your child succeed in school starts the day they are born. Developmentally appropriate learning and play activities can make the most of this crucial period, helping children get ready to succeed in life and in school.

Critical skills, like motivation, self-discipline, focus and self-esteem, begin to take root from birth to 5 years old.

Successful people share these traits and we must give children the tools to develop these essential skills. The early years provide the richest opportunity, more than any other time of life, to prepare the brain for a lifetime of learning. Results, not effort, are what matters.

Strong families are the building blocks of a strong society.

Positive, nurturing experiences in a child's first 5 years lay the foundation for a lifetime. It's crucial that parents have the tools they need to support young children with stable, nurturing environments in their earliest years.

"Healthy development in the early childhood years provides the building blocks for educational achievement, responsible and disciplined citizenship, lifelong wellbeing, strong kinship and communities, and successful parenting of the next generation. What can we do as parents, relatives, and leaders during this incredibly critical period is to ensure our children have a strong foundation of development, family and cultural values, and love. We need to practice and acknowledge the importance of early childhood development and learn how to support children and families during this critical stage. Our Navajo children hold the future of our great Navajo Nation."

Parents—Quality First Off Reservation Child Care Scholarship Program

Balancing parenthood with your education and/or career can be overwhelming. The Quality First Navajo Nation, Arizona Off-Reservation Scholarship Program was designed for families who are permanent residents of the Navajo Nation but are temporarily living in other parts of the state while they pursue a post-secondary education. These scholarships are awarded directly to the families and transfer with the child.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Must enroll in a minimum of one course at an accredited college or university each session courses are offered.
- Must be a permanent resident of the Navajo Nation (living off tribal lands to attend school)
- Have a household income at or below 200% of the current year's federal poverty level
- Have a child between the ages of 0-5 not yet eligible for kindergarten

Instructions:

Please download the Navajo Nation Off-Reservation Family Application from azftfscholarships.org/scholarship-types or call Valley of the Sun United Way (VSUW) at 1-866-973-0012 to have the forms e-mailed to you.

After completing these forms fax or email them to Valley of the Sun United Way at (602) 240-6326 or regionalscholarships@vsuw.org. Once VSUW receives and reviews your application you will be contacted with a decision.

If approved, you will need to select a Quality First participating provider with a star rating of 2 or higher. The Quality First center that you select will be notified and sent an award letter with your approval packet.

Quality First works with child care and preschool providers across Arizona to improve the quality of their early learning settings for children from birth to age 5.

More than 1,000 child care centers, homes and preschool programs across the state of participate in Quality First. Each is supported with training and resources to help improve their programs in ways that nurture the emotional, social and academic development of every child.

The Navajo Nation Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) Program's primary mission is to provide quality child care to the Navajo communities. The purpose of providing child care is to ensure that the family can become self-sufficient through employment or becoming employable in the near future. This can be done by employment, job training or through higher education. This is accomplished through the tribal child care centers or private providers.

Families interested in child care through the Child Care & Development Fund must apply with their local Casework Unit to be considered for enrollment into any CCDF child care provider program.

Early Intervention Information

What is Early Intervention?

Parents, guardians, foster parents and family members know their child best. They observe the health and development of their child daily through routines, play and interactions. Sometimes parents/caregivers may have concerns that their child is not meeting the milestones for his or her age. Other times home visitors, health care providers, child care providers or early education teachers may identify concerns for a child's development and share them with the parent/caregiver.

These concerns may be observed by the way a child:

- Plays, sees, hears (physical development),
- Interacts with others (social-emotional development),
- Learns (cognitive development),
- and communicates (language/speech development).

Why is Early Intervention important?

Addressing concerns early on in a child's life is important. If the parent, guardian or caregiver is interested in learning more about the additional support their child can receive, there are early intervention resources that can help them. Early intervention resources can have a maximum impact by enhancing the early growth and development in infants and toddlers, who may have or are at risk for developmental delays or disabilities, by providing individualized support and services to the child and their family.

- Children who receive early intervention have improved outcomes and increased success and independence in the long run.
- Early intervention can have a positive impact on a child's health, development and academic success.
- Early intervention therapies can alleviate the financial burden of therapy in the long run by reducing the need for continuing intensive therapy.

What can I do if I have concerns about my child's development?

- Talk to your child's doctor and share your concerns. Don't wait. Acting early can make a real difference!
- Complete a milestone checklist for your child's age.
 - Center for Disease Control (CDC) Milestone checklist Search online: CDC Milestone Checklist. The CDC's Developmental Milestones link will provide checklists for age 2 months to 5 years.
 - CDC's Milestone Tracker App Download it free today on iOS and Android devices.
- Ask about a developmental screening.
 - Ask your child's doctor to conduct a developmental screening and/or if you are concerned about possible signs of autism, an autism screening (generally completed at 18 and 24 months).
 - Parents have FREE access to the Ages & Stages Questionnaires® (ASQ), one of many general developmental screening tools, by visiting easterseals.com and searching ASQ.
- Get an Evaluation for your child.
 - Call your local public school district to get information about their upcoming Child Find events. The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) includes the Child Find mandate. Child Find requires all Public Education Agencies (school districts) to identify, locate and evaluate ALL children birth through 21, who may have or are at risk for developmental delays or disabilities. Screening procedures include vision and hearing screenings along with developmental screenings.

Early Intervention Services on the Navajo Nation

CHILD IDENTIFICATION

There is a concern about the child's growth, development and/or learning. These concerns can be identified by parents/ caregivers, relatives, home visitors, child care providers, school teachers or health care providers based on:

- Observation – the way a child plays, sees, hears, interacts with others, learns and communicates and/or
- A milestone checklist or a developmental screening completed.

THE CHILD IS BIRTH TO AGE 3.

Referral & Intake

- The parent/guardian can start the online or phone referral process for their child; or,
- A home visitor, child care provider, early education teacher or health care provider obtains permission from the parent/guardian before referring and starting the online or phone referral process.

Referral & Intake

- The parent/guardian can contact their local school district (Public Education Agency) to get information on the next Child Find event, where the child can be evaluated; or,
- The parent/guardian can take the child to their local school district (Public Education Agency) to be evaluated; or,
- A home visitor, child care provider, early education teacher or health care provider obtains permission from the parent/guardian before referring the child to be evaluated by their local school district or Child Find event.

Evaluation & Assessment

The **school district** (for children age 3-21) conducts a comprehensive multidisciplinary developmental evaluation and assessment of the child's development and the family's needs and concerns within **45 calendar days** of the date they are notified about the child.

Evaluation & Assessment

The **Early Intervention program** (for children age 0-3) conducts a comprehensive multidisciplinary developmental evaluation and assessment of the child's development and the family's needs and concerns.

ELIGIBILITY DETERMINATION

Child is Found Ineligible for Services

If the child is age 0-3:

The child's family receives information on growth and development. Referrals are made to other community resources, if appropriate. The child may be reevaluated at a later date.

If the child is age 3-21:

The school system will notify the parent/guardian in writing and explain why the child has been found "not eligible." The parent/guardian will be given information about what they can do if they disagree with the decision.

Child is Found Eligible for Services

If the child is age 0-3:

Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) The family of an eligible child meets with the Early Intervention (EI) team to create an IFSP, usually in the home or in a community setting. The EI team provides services as outlined in the IFSP. The EI team reviews the child's IFSP as needed throughout the year. The IFSP is updated annually with the family.

Transition: As the child approaches their third (3rd) birthday, the family and local EI program prepare for transition to special education preschool, school district (K-12) and/or other community based services.

If the child is age 3-21:

When a concern is identified through evaluation procedures, the parent/guardian must be notified within 10 school days and informed of procedures to follow up on the child's needs. For example:

- The child may be referred to the school's study team for pre-intervention services; or,
- If the child may have a disability, a comprehensive evaluation will be necessary to determine the child's eligibility for special education and related services. A team, of which the parent/guardian will be a member of, will meet to begin the process.

Growing In Beauty – Arizona Early Intervention

The Navajo Nation Growing in Beauty — Arizona Early Intervention Program provides culturally appropriate services to Navajo children age birth to 5 years old and their families. The Growing in Beauty staff provide service coordination and direct services, which include:

- receiving and processing referrals from pediatricians, health care professionals, and other service providers;
- providing developmental screening assessments and evaluations for children;
- making referrals and ensuring supports into appropriate early childhood settings or preschool programs;
- providing ongoing developmental screening and family support/resources;
- and providing advocacy and training for families.

Vocational Rehabilitation – Department of Diné Education OSERS

The Department of Diné Education — Office of Special Education and Rehabilitation Services (OSERS) provides vocational rehabilitation services to eligible American Indians with disabilities who are interested in going to work. The goal of Vocational Rehabilitation is to assist people with disabilities to obtain and maintain employment.

What services may be provided?

Vocational Rehabilitation services are designed to achieve an employment objective consistent with the unique strengths, resources, priorities, concerns, abilities and capabilities of the individual.

The following are the types of vocational rehabilitation services an individual with a disability may qualify for:

- an assessment for determining eligibility and vocational need;
- counseling, guidance and work-related placement services;
- mental/physical restoration;
- maintenance for additional costs incurred while participating in rehabilitation;
- tuition, books/supplies, personal needs, allowances, room and/or board, transportation;
- interpreter services for individuals who are deaf and services for those who are blind or visually impaired;
- occupational licenses, tools, equipment, initial stocks, and supplies;
- recruitment and training services;
- rehabilitation technology services;
- independent living services;
- Native Healing services;
- and information and referral.

Who is eligible for Vocational Rehabilitation Services?

To be eligible for Vocational Rehabilitation services, an individual must:

- be an enrolled member of an Indian Tribe;
- reside on or near the reservation (10 mile radius);
- have a physical or mental impairment which constitutes or results in a substantial impediment to employment;
- and require vocational rehabilitation services in terms of an employment outcome.

How to apply for Vocational Rehabilitation

Write, call or visit the office nearest your home for an appointment. Individuals will need to complete an application for vocational rehabilitation services. Bring in records or information about your disability (e.g. records from your doctor, psychologist or school). Please call your local office for eligibility and location.

Emergency Food Program — This program provides assistance to low income families in need of immediate food support due to an emergency or a recurring financial hardship. Qualified clients receive one box per month per household. The St. Jude Food Bank also provides support for individuals living with food insecurity and needing support for the day.

Healthy Beginnings — Healthy Beginnings aims to give children a healthy beginning in life with healthy nutritious foods. This program supports families who have children age birth to 5 years old. Each family is limited to one per month. This is an income and age qualified program. Proof of children's ages and custody are required.

Bargain Box — Consumers can come to the food bank to purchase the \$15 Bargain Box with cash or food stamps. Each prefilled box is worth \$30 of food (perishable and non-perishable), cold or frozen food, laundry detergent and bathroom tissue. Bargain Boxes can be purchased at the St. Jude Food Bank.

Bulk Buying Club — Each food item is individually priced. Products vary from 10 pound tubes of ground beef, 8-10 pounds of pork roast, 20-25 pounds of chuck roast, 14 piece drum stick packets, 12 piece chicken packets, 2 pounds of Cheddar cheese or Colby Jack cheese and Blue Bird Flour. Food products are from Sam's Club. Cash or Food Stamps are accepted, Monday-Friday, 10AM-2PM.

The Section 184 Indian Home Loan Guarantee Program is a home mortgage product specifically designed for American Indian and Alaska Native families, Alaska villages, tribes, or tribally designated entities. Congress established this program in 1992 to facilitate homeownership and increase access to capital in Native American Communities. With Section 184 financing, borrowers can get into a home with a low down payment and flexible underwriting. Section 184 loans can be used, both on and off native lands, for new construction, rehabilitation, purchase of an existing home, or refinance.

Process: The borrower applies for the Section 184 loan with a participating lender (list on website), and works with the tribe and Bureau of Indian Affairs if leasing tribal land. The lender then evaluates the necessary loan documentation and submits the loan for approval to HUD's Office of Loan Guarantee.

Health Insurance Coverage

Health coverage is important for you and your family to get the medical care you need. While some individuals and families have health insurance through their employer or through their state's Medicaid programs, others choose to purchase their health insurance through the Federally Facilitated Marketplace (FFM). To be eligible to enroll in health coverage through the Marketplace, you:

- Must live in the United States
- Must be a U.S. citizen or national (or be lawfully present).
- Can't be incarcerated.

If you have Medicare coverage, you're not eligible to use the Marketplace to buy a health or dental plan. Open enrollment runs from November 1 to mid-December. Plan coverage starts on January 1. To apply for health coverage through the Marketplace, visit [healthcare.gov](https://www.healthcare.gov) or call 1(800) 318-2596.

Arizona

The Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) offers medical programs and resources to serve Arizona residents who meet certain income and other requirements. 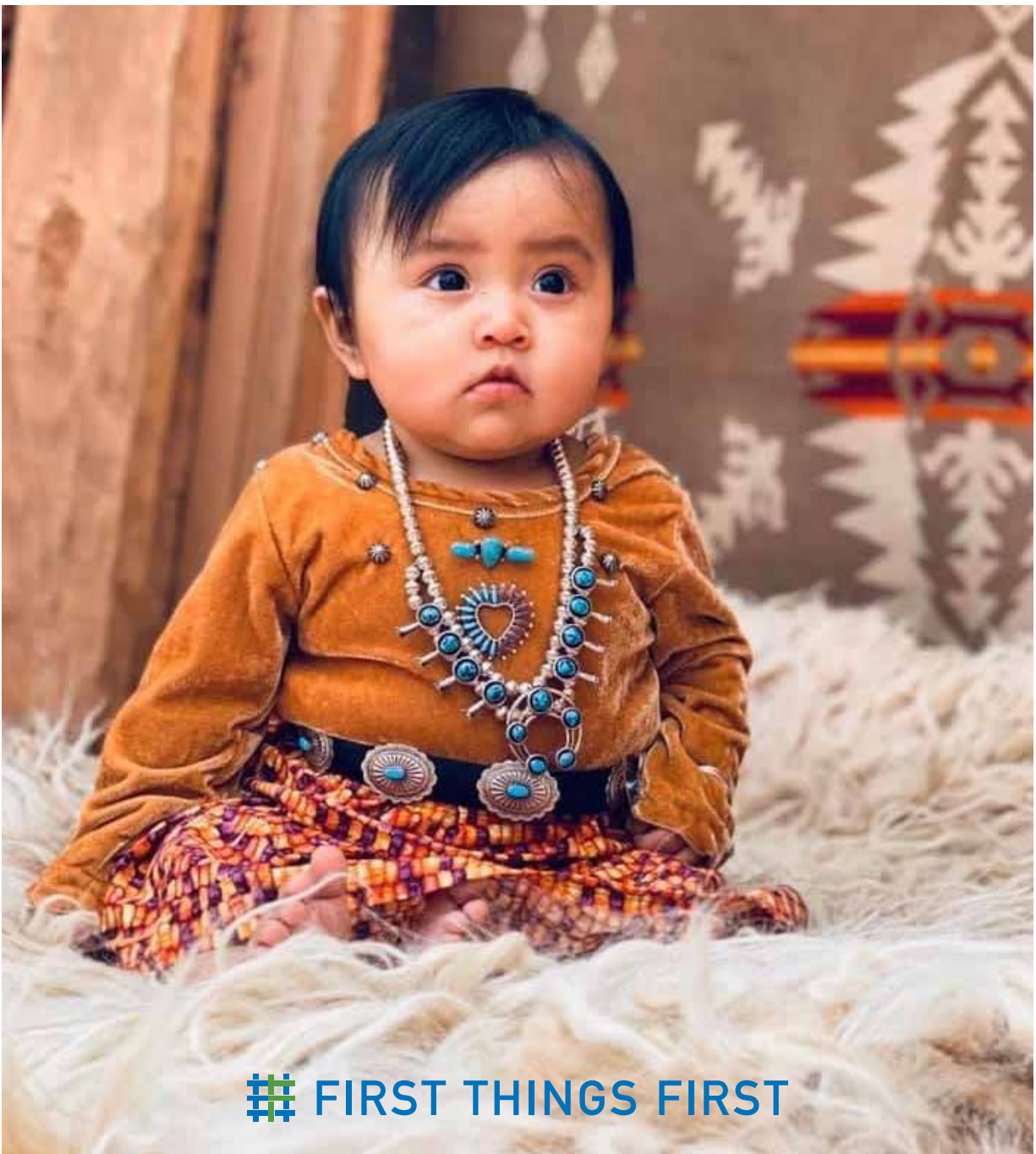
